During these unprecedented days, Pastors Kooi & Prin invite you to join this service in a dimly lit room of your choosing. After the extinguishing of the Christ candle, they invite you to join for a time of prayerful silence before continuing with your Friday evening.

May the Lord richly bless you this night, as – by God's unmerited grace – we anticipate how this story triumphantly ends on Sunday!

Announcements

Invocation, Confession & Absolution

- L: In the name of the Father ⁺ and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.

Our Fifth Word Response

L: Let us pray...Lord Jesus Christ – you are the Living Water and you have promised that those who hunger and thirst for righteousness will be satisfied. Yet, on our behalf, you thirsted and endured the agony of the cross. Give us faith to trust that your thirst on the cross supplies all that we need. Amen.

Extinguishing of the Fifth Candle

The Sixth Word from the Cross – "The Word of *VICTORY*" John 19:30

Our Sixth Word Response

L: Let us pray...Lord Jesus – you have loved us (and you STILL love us) with an everlasting love. On the cross, you could have found the pain too much to bear. You could have come down from the cross and let us take the punishment we rightly deserve. However, you remained there until it was all finished. Give us the confidence to follow you completely through our trials because you are the author and perfecter of our faith. Amen.

Extinguishing of the Sixth Candle

The Last Word from the Cross – "The Word of REUNION" Luke 23:46

Extinguishing of the Final Candle

The final candle is extinguished through the forceful closing of the pulpit's Bible. This act is symbolic of the sealing of Christ's tomb.

Dismissal

Again, Pastors Prin & Kooi now invite you to spend time in silent prayer considering ALL the Lord has done through the cross...for you.

As you turn on lights around you again, take a few moments to remember the triumph which awaits you – solely because of Him – this coming Sunday!
