# FIRST SUNDAY IN ADVENT

December 3, 2023 - 9:30 a.m.

Throughout the season of Advent, you are welcome to try one of the practices for confession, which is kneeling. Kneeling has a rich meaning and symbolism in Scripture. It is associated with prayer, humility, devotion, and repentance. The act of kneeling during confession reminds us of this, and it also reflects the season's penitential nature. Whether you kneel, stand, or sit, we are all unworthy to come before our Lord because of our sin, and we thank God for the forgiveness that He has freely given us in Jesus Christ. If you would like to try this practice, we ask that you would gently put the kneeler down at the beginning of the service and would gently put it back up after Pastor is finished speaking the Absolution and the congregation responds.



### **Lighting of the Advent Wreath**

Today, the season of Advent begins, and the church tracks the time until Christmas with the lighting of the Advent wreath. The word Advent appropriately means coming, and that is what the season celebrates. It celebrates the coming of Christ in various ways. Each week, we will focus on a different aspect of Christ's coming as we light a candle on the Advent wreath.

Today, as we light our first candle, we call to mind Jesus' promise that He will return. In our Gospel reading, Jesus describes the day of His coming. "But in those days, after that tribulation, the sun will be darkened, and the moon will not give its light, and the stars will be falling from heaven, and the powers in the heavens will be shaken. And then they will see the Son of Man coming in clouds with great power and glory. And then He will send out the angels and gather His elect from the four winds, from the ends of the earth to the ends of heaven." In our Epistle reading, Paul encourages us with these words: "...as you wait for the revealing of our Lord Jesus Christ, who will sustain you to the end, guiltless in the day of our Lord Jesus Christ. God is faithful, by whom you were called into the fellowship of His Son, Jesus Christ, our Lord." As His beloved and baptized people, we have nothing to fear on that day. He prepares and keeps us ready for His coming.

As the first candle is lit to remind us of how our Lord will come again, we sing selected verses of "Savior of the Nations, Come." The One Who came in the manger so long ago will come again in glory.

"Savior of the Nations, Come" *LSB* 332 stanzas 1, 2, 3, and 8 1. Savior of the nations, come, Virgin's Son, make here Your home! Marvel now, O heav'n and earth, That the Lord chose such a birth.


First Reading

Isaiah 64:1–9







### **Distribution**



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
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
