And divided tongues as of fire appeared to them and rested on each one of them. And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues as the Spirit gave them utterance. Now there were dwelling in Jerusalem Jews, devout men from every nation under heaven. And at this sound the multitude came together, and they were bewildered, because each one was hearing them speak in his own language. And they were amazed and astonished, saying, "Are not all these who are speaking Galileans? And how is it that we hear, each of us in his own native language? Parthians and Medes and Elamites and residents of Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya belonging to Cyrene, and visitors from Rome, both Jews and proselytes, Cretans and Arabians-we hear them telling in our own tongues the mighty works of God." And all were amazed and perplexed, saying to one another, "What does this mean?" But others mocking said, "They are filled with new wine." But Peter, standing with the eleven, lifted up his voice and addressed them, "Men of Judea and all who dwell in Jerusalem, let this be known to you, and give ear to my words. For these men are not drunk, as you suppose, since it is only the third hour of the day. But this is what was uttered through the prophet Joel: 'And in the last days it shall be, God declares, that I will pour out my Spirit on all flesh, and your sons and your daughters shall prophesy, and your young men shall see visions, and your old men shall dream dreams; even on my male servants and female servants in those days I will pour out my Spirit, and they shall prophesy. And I will show wonders in the heavens above and signs on the earth below, blood, and fire, and vapor of smoke; the sun shall be turned to darkness and the moon to blood, before the day of the Lord comes, the great and magnificent day. And it shall come to pass that everyone who calls upon the name of the Lord shall be saved.""

## Hymn Highlight

## "Come, Holy Ghost, Creator Blest" LSB 498/499

The hymn "Come, Holy Ghost, Creator Blest" is one of the greatest hymns on the work of the Holy Spirit. It is traditionally attributed to Rabanus Maurus, who lived from 780 to 856, and was the abbot of Fulda and archbishop of Mainz. Originally written in Latin, the hymn became well loved and used. By the eleventh century, the hymn was typically used at ordinations (and still is commonly used at them today), and from the twelfth century onwards, it appeared in hymnals in England, France, Germany, Switzerland, Italy, and Spain, where it was appointed for use at Pentecost (when it is typically sung today). In 1307, the hymn became a standard element in British coronations when it was used for Edward II.

Martin Luther made a seven-stanza translation of the hymn in 1524 and composed his own tune for it. *LSB* 498 is the tune that Luther composed while *LSB* 499 is the traditional chant of the hymn. These hymns have the same lyrics, but different tunes. *LSB* 498 is historically the more known of the two, while *LSB* 499 has typically been done by choirs and more established singers.

Today, we'll alternate between the two, with the congregation singing selected verses of it from *LSB* 498 and the choir singing selected verses of it from *LSB* 499. As we sing this hymn, we stand with the myriad of saints who have sung it in Latin, German, and English that have come before us.
