

Lighting of the Advent Wreath

Today, the season of Advent begins, and the church tracks the time until Christmas with the lighting of the Advent wreath. The word *Advent* appropriately means *coming*, and that is what the season celebrates. It celebrates the coming of Christ in various ways. Each week, we will focus on a different aspect of Christ's coming as we light a candle on the Advent wreath.

Today, as we light our first candle, we call to mind the promises of Jesus' coming made in the Old Testament. In our Old Testament text we hear, "Behold, the days are coming, declares the LORD, when I will fulfill the promise I made to the house of Israel and the house of Judah. In those days and at that time I will cause a righteous Branch to spring up for David, and He shall execute justice and righteousness in the land. In those days Judah will be saved, and Jerusalem will dwell securely. And this is the name by which it will be called: 'The LORD is our righteousness.'" (*Jeremiah 33:14–16*)

As the first candle is lit to remind us how God kept His promises regarding Jesus' first coming, we sing stanza 1 of "Once He Came in Blessing."

Once He came in blessing, All our sins redressing Came in likeness lowly, Son of God most holy; Bore the cross to save us; Hope and freedom gave us.

What thanksgiving can we return to God for you, for all the joy that we feel for your sake before our God, as we pray most earnestly night and day that we may see you face to face and supply what is lacking in your faith? Now may our God and Father himself, and our Lord Jesus, direct our way to you, and may the Lord make you increase and abound in love for one another and for all, as we do for you, so that he may establish your hearts blameless in holiness before our God and Father, at the coming of our Lord Jesus with all his saints.




The Words of Our Lord

Distribution
